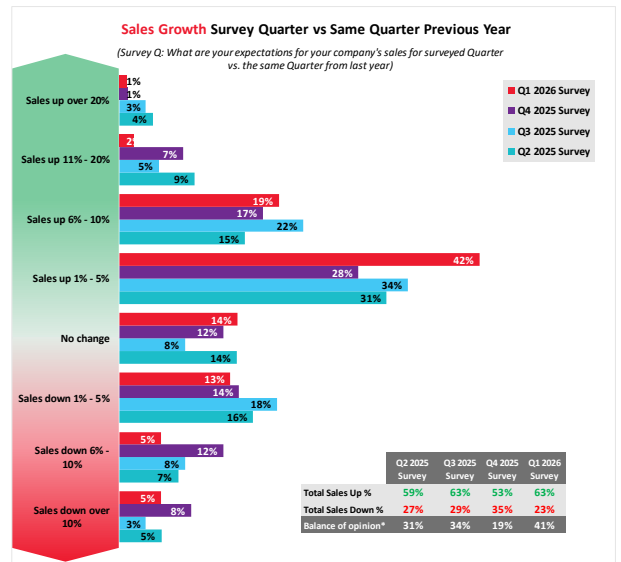
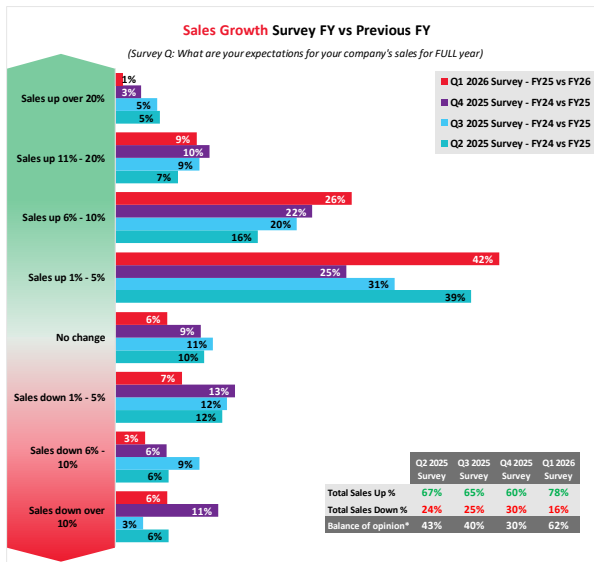
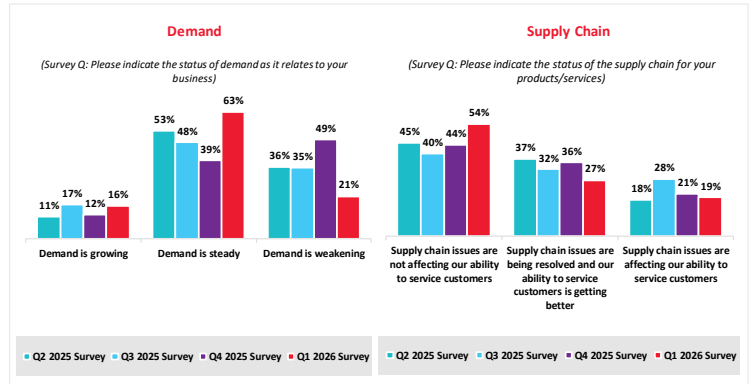
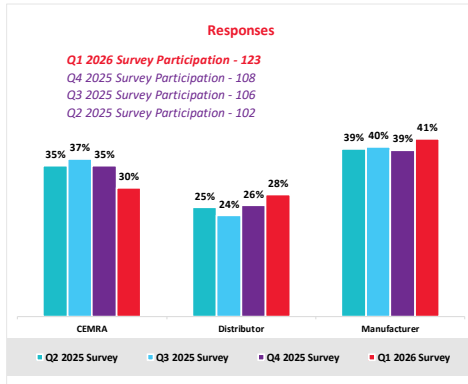


Electro-Federation Canada has released the **Q1 2026 Business Confidence Survey Results**. A total of **123 key association** contacts participated in the latest survey, maintaining a stable and representative sample across membership segments. Results show **rising optimism**, with **78%** of respondents expecting sales growth in **2026**—an increase from **60%** in the previous survey. However, comments continue to highlight ongoing uncertainty, largely driven by concerns around U.S. tariffs. Looking specifically at **Q1 2026**, **63%** of respondents anticipate **growth in sales** compared to same quarter last year, and **42%** expect **growth between 1-5%**. Demand indicators have strengthened as well, with **63%** of respondents reporting **steady demand**—up from **39%** in the previous survey. Supply chain pressures also appear to be easing, with **54%** of respondents reporting that these **issues are not impacting** their ability to serve customers—up from **44%** in the previous quarter.
